




## COMMANDING GENERAL, MARINE CORPS COMBAT DEVELOPMENT COMMAND AND DEPUTY COMMANDANT, COMBAT DEVELOPMENT AND INTEGRATION VIOLENCE PREVENTION POLICY STATEMENT



Every member of MCCDC/CD&I plays a vital role in our success. It is Marine Corps policy to provide a safe environment for all Marines, civilian personnel, family members, and visitors. Acts of physical violence against persons or property, physical or verbal threats, intimidation, harassment, or other disruptive behavior that causes fear for personal safety will not be tolerated.



Leadership is the key to violence prevention. All individuals must maintain awareness related to their role and responsibilities and report warning signs or indicators of potential violence in a timely manner via the chain of command or appropriate entity such as another supervisor, Provost Marshal's Office/Military Police Department, or contractor representative. Any member of this organization that commits a violent act will be punished and held accountable for their actions. Recognizing and reporting warning signs/indicators of potential violence are the foundations of this program and are the responsibility of all personnel.

The Corps values of honor, courage, and commitment are the bedrock of what the Marine Corps holds true. Compromising is not an option. Allowing violence within this organization is not an option. Removing the dignity of a member of this command through violent acts, regardless of circumstances, is unacceptable behavior...at any time. Each member of the command is responsible for supporting the prevention of violence and must take this responsibility very seriously to help make this an environment in which we will succeed in our mission.
